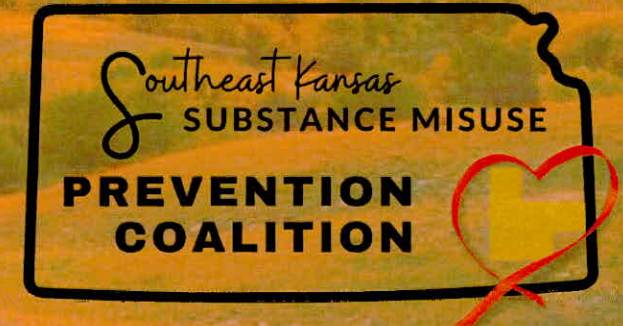

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## ABOUT US

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The Southeast Kansas Substance Misuse Prevention Coalition is a working group comprised of agency and organization representative members as well as community members at large, located within Southeast Kansas. Representatives work together to address a variety of issues surrounding substance use disorder (SUD), opioid use disorder (OUD) and addiction.

Prior to 2021, the coalition was funded under a federal planning grant as well as a grant received from the Kansas Department of Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) for youth prevention. In September 2021, the coalition received NEW federal funding for three years in the form of an implementation grant from the Department of Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) for the Rural Communities Opioid Response Program (RCORP).

The coalition was able to expand from three counties in 2018 to the current six in 2021 - Allen, Bourbon, Coffey, Neosho, Wilson and Woodson.



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## MISSION STATEMENT

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**To provide leadership and share expertise in reducing morbidity and mortality associated with SUD/OUD in our communities by strengthening the capacity of collaboration for prevention, treatment and recovery resources.**



SEK Recovery Housing strives to provide a safe, secure, and healthy living environment that promotes abstinence-based pathways of recovery - improving one's physical, mental, spiritual, and social wellbeing.

We provide peer-led recovery support to individuals during and after SUD/OUD treatment, as they transition to living independently and productively in their chosen community.

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## THE WORK WE DO

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- Facilitate work groups for Prevention, Treatment, and Recovery programs
- Provide peer-led programs and referrals to recovery-oriented systems of care
- Provide transportation services to/from Drug Court and/or treatment services
- Fund Medically-Assisted-Treatment (MAT) case management services
- Provide Payor of Last Resort program for treatment and/or recovery supplies
- Fund prevention campaigns
- Provide a speakers bureau
- Provide Naloxone and training for overdose prevention
- Teach Safe medication disposal techniques
- Provide Telehealth access
- Data collection and reporting
- Provider of Peer Support services
