



The Board of Woodson County Commissioners met in a regular business session on October 10, 2023, with Chairman Jerry Sedlacek, Vice-Chairman Justin Clark, Member Kevin Stuber, Attorney Zelda Schlotterbeck and Certified County Clerk Tesla Bayles.

The Pledge of allegiance was recited.

Clark made the motion to approve the agenda. Stuber seconded it, with Sedlacek making it unanimous.

Clark made the motion to approve the minutes from last week. Stuber seconded it, with Sedlacek making it unanimous.

Clark made the motion to recess into executive session for Attorney Client privileges to discuss legal liability for 8 minutes with the Commissioners, and County Attorney starting at 8:47 a.m. and reconvening at 8:55 a.m. in the Commissioners Meeting Room. Stuber seconded it, with Sedlacek making it unanimous.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Timothy Dimick updated the board on Road and Bridge progress in the county. Road complaints were discussed. Right of ways will be trimmed.

Jarred Helkenberg introduced the new Deputy Jonathan Turner.

EMS Cari Cavender presented Weekly Ambulance Run log. The concrete project in the bay was discussed.

Noxious Weed/Maintenance Director Jarrod McVey came to the board to discuss maintenance in the Southwind Extension Office. McVey will be getting bids for fixing walls in the Extension Office. Maintenance on the Courthouse was discussed. The board suggested removing the piece of guttering that is hanging off the roof before Hay Fest.

Sedlacek discussed the possibility of the county assisting the city to install a playground behind the library in the future.

Clark made the motion to recess for a 5-minute break. Stuber seconded it, with Sedlacek making it unanimous.

The board decided to have a public forum in Piqua to discuss the sewage system. The board will speak with Judy Westerman to see what day would be best to hold the forum.

Sedlacek made the motion to table the discussion of having a tax sale until January 1st, 2024. Clark seconded it, with Stuber making it unanimous.


