

RESOLUTION NO. 04-08

A RESOLUTION TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF WOODSON COUNTY, KANSAS. THE PROPOSITION OF LEVYING A ONE-PERCENT (1.0%) RETAILERS' SALES TAX IN THE COUNTY.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, Woodson County, Kansas:

1. The Board of County Commissioners of Woodson County, Kansas deems it to be in the public interest to increase the county sales tax one percent for the purpose of property tax relief on the county.
2. K.S.A. 12-187(b)(1) authorizes the Governing Body of Woodson County, Kansas (the County) to submit to qualified electors of the County the question of levying a retailers' sales tax in the County; and
3. The Governing Body of the County has determined that revenue is needed for the purposes described herein:

IT IS RESOLVED THIS 16 DAY OF November, 2004, at the regular meeting of the Board of County commissioners, Woodson County Courthouse, Woodson County, Kansas that:

Section 1. The Board of county Commissioners of Woodson County, Kansas hereby adopts the following countywide retailers' sales tax question to be placed on the April 5, 2005 General Election ballot. The proposition to be voted on shall appear on the ballot as follows:

Shall the following be adopted?

Shall a retailers' sales tax in the amount of one percent (1.0%) be levied in Woodson county, Kansas to take effect on October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2005 and expire fifteen (15) years after its effective date with the proceeds of the sales tax distributed to the County and the cities located within the County as required by law, the County's share to be used to provide for:

Property tax relief

All pursuant to K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 121-187 et seq.

Section 2. If approved by a majority of the electors voting on the question, such tax shall be subject to all applicable state laws and administrative rules and regulations of the Kansas Department of Revenue. The services of the Department Revenue shall be utilized to administer, enforce, collect and apportion such tax among the County and each city located in the County.

Section 3. The Woodson County Clerk, as the County Election Officer is authorized and directed to give notice of the election so provided by law, by publishing a notice of election once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the County, as provided in K.S.A. 10-120, with the first publication to be not less than twenty-one days prior to the date of the election. The vote at the election shall be by ballot, and the proposition stated above shall be printed on the ballot, together with the voting instructions as provided by law.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect after passage by the Governing Body of the County.
