Municipal Accounting Section Example Charter Resolution For County To Exempt Itself From Aggregate Tax Lid

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CHARTER RESOLUTION NO. 95-02

A CHARTER RESOLUTION EXEMPTING THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF Woodson COUNTY, KANSAS, FROM THE PROVISIONS OF K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 79-5028, AND AMENDMENTS THERETO, AND PROVIDING SUBSTITUTE AND ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS ON THE SAME SUBJECT REMOVING ANY LIMITATION OF AGGREGATE TAX LEVIES.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF Woodson COUNTY, KANSAS:

Section 1. The County of $\underline{\text{Woodson}}$, by the power vested in it by K.S.A. 19-101a and as provided by K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 79-5036(b), hereby elects to exempt itself from the provisions of K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 79-5028. K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 79-5028 is part of an enactment commonly known as the Kansas property tax lid law, which enactment applies to this county but does not apply uniformly to all counties.

Section 2. The following is hereby substituted for the provisions of K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 79-5028: The provisions of K.S.A. 79-5021 to 79-5033, inclusive, and amendments thereto, shall not limit the levy of taxes by the Governing Body of the County of Woodson Body of the County of _

Section 3. This Charter Resolution shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official county newspaper.

Section 4. This Charter Resolution shall take effect 61 days after final publication unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed, requiring a referendum to be held on the Resolution as provided in K.S.A. 19-101b in which case this Charter Resolution shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
