

The Board of Woodson County Commissioners met in a regular business session on June 5, 2018 at 8:30 a.m. with Chairman Yoho, Vice Chairman Forsyth, Member Weseloh, County Attorney Schlotterbeck and County Clerk Denice Julian.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by Yoho, Forsyth, Weseloh and Julian.

The Agenda was unanimously approved as amended.

The Minutes of the previous meeting was approved as printed.

Schlotterbeck informed the Board that Heritage Hills Apartments does not need to be put on a ballot to be sold. The Board needs to advertise that it is for sale and decide what to sale it for. No action was taken.

Discussion was held on the Resolution 18-04 about Roll off Container Rental. The Board asked that Solid Waste Supervisor L.D. McCormick to attend the meeting.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Dane Onnen met with the Board to discuss road matters. Discussion was held on Nighthawk Road. Onnen is having rock brought in to fix the problem. He informed the Board that he has been getting calls on the placement of the telephone poles north of Camp Ascension.

Solid Waste Supervisor L.D. McCormick met with the Board to revise the contract signed in the Treasurer's office when purchasing roll off containers rental for house demolition. McCormick said he would get with the Treasurer.

Forsyth updated the Board on the most recent Zoning Meeting.

Forsyth informed the Board that the Boiler has been shut off and that Design Mechanical has been contacted to come move the heater in the Attorney's office and fix the pipe in the Register of Deeds office.

Discussion was held on the doors at the courthouse being locked.




The meeting adjourned at 10:20 p.m.
