

The Board of Woodson County Commissioners met in a regular business session on July 3, 2018 at 8:30 a.m. with Chairman Yoho, Vice Chairman Forsyth, Member Weseloh, County Attorney Schlotterbeck and County Clerk Denice Julian.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by Yoho, Forsyth, Weseloh and Julian.

The Agenda was unanimously approved as amended.

The Minutes of the previous meeting was approved as corrected.

Forsyth wanted to remind everyone that a memo was sent out about the custodian. He was to be contacted about issues not the custodian. He wanted everyone to know that this is the process that needs to be followed.

The County Attorney wanted to remind the Board that there should not be any conversations between Board members before and after the meetings.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Dane Onnen met with the Board to discuss Road and Bridge matters. He informed the Board that he had sent dump trucks over to Eureka when the Tornado hit the town last Wednesday evening and Friday.

The Board came back into session at 9:38 a.m. with all members present. No action taken.

McCormick asked the Board about hiring a part time employee with no benefits for the summer.

Discussion was held on the Pete needing to go in for repairs.

Ambulance Director Tommy Stewart met with the Board that the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services for an inspection on his department. Based on current state law, and Board policy, no critical violations were noted during the inspection process. The Board thanked Stewart for bringing this to the Board.


Stewart informed the Board that he had sent an Ambulance over to Eureka last Wednesday for standby after the Tornado.




Forsyth made the motion to approve the longevity bonuses for employees. Yoho seconded the motion. Weseloh abstained. Motion carried.
